Info You Need to Know

Health & Safety: Camp Siloam recognizes that the health and safety of a child while they are away from home is of utmost importance. If your camper has severe food allergies, please call Camp Siloam so they can discuss your camper's needs. For information on the camp's policies regarding health and safety, go to the Camp Siloam website and click on the "about" tab or contact the camp office at 479-250-1865.

Camper Medications: Please pack your camper's prescription medicine in a 1-gallon Ziploc bag and label the bag with your camper's name and Park Hill Baptist Church. It will be collected on the first day of camp at registration. Remind your camper and their leaders about your child's medicine. Children will need an adult with them to take medicine distributed by the camp nurse.

Do campers need to bring extra money? We recommend campers bring \$30 to \$60 to camp as spending money. The Hub and the Two Canoes Camp Store have items such as shirts, hats, snacks and more awesome stuff that are great for campers to keep as memories of their time at Camp Siloam. Snacks range from \$1.50 to \$4.00 and drinks \$1.75. Park Hill will provide a snack each day during one of the group times. There are no additional fees for activities. Every year, campers collectively give to an International Mission Board project. An offering will be taken on Thursday evening.

What's the dress code? Camp Siloam requests campers be humble and modest in the way they dress.

- Tights or Leggings must be accompanied by a shirt that extends past a camper's fingertips.
- No "short shorts." Shorts must extend past a camper's fingertips.
- No bikinis or speedos. (Tankini bathing suits are okay as long as the top overlaps the bottom).
- No spaghetti strap shirts or visible bras.
- No deep-cut tank tops for girls or boys.

What NOT to Bring

- Cell Phones or music players
- Handheld gaming devices
- Alcohol
- Tobacco
- Illegal Drugs
- Weapons or fireworks
- Pets

Travel Details

What to Bring

- Water Bottle
 - Backpack
 - Sleeping bag or sheets & blanket
 - Pillow
 - Spending money for snacks, Camp Store, and missions offering
 - Clothing: T-shirts, Shorts, Jeans, Pajamas, Socks & Underwear
- *we recommend 2 pair of clothing per day & don't forget about clothing for the dress up days listed on the front of this packet*
- Modest Swimwear
 - Light jacket or long sleeved shirts in case of cool nights
 - Clothes that can get messy for some recreation times
 - Adventure sandals & Tennis shoes
 - Shower sandals or flip flops
 - Rain coat/umbrella/poncho
 - Toiletries, Soap, Deodorant, etc.
 - Towels (for shower and pool) & Washcloth
 - Bug repellent
 - Wristwatch
 - Sunscreen
 - Flashlight, Bible, Notebook & Pen or Pencil
 - Mask (optional)
 - Bag for dirty clothes

It might be a good idea to

- Pack your camper's clothes in a ziploc by the day so they don't have to worry about picking out an outfit each morning
- (Should you want to write letters) Put letters in your child's clothing bag each day OR put them in envelopes and write your camper's name and the day you want them to get it. Letters will be passed out each evening at church group time.

How to Register

Step 1:

Visit parkhillbaptist.org/kidscamp to make \$90 non-refundable deposit to hold your spot. This amount is non-refundable to us as well.

Camp Cost: \$335

Step 2:

You will be sent a link to the official registration form. This is a Camp Siloam form and info will go directly to the camp.

Step 3:

Pay Balance by July 1st through the payment portal at parkhillbaptist.org/kidscamp

Step 4:

Complete final paperwork before camp. There will be a travel permission form, health screening and camper medication forms that will be due right before we travel to camp. These will be sent to you closer to the date of camp.

Parents who attend as a camp sponsor will get a discount on one child's camp registration fee. If you are interested in attending, please let Jessica know. At this time, we are enlisting two male sponsors. Depending on the number of campers registered, we may enlist more camp sponsors to attend.
